In-Person Youth Group Resumes October 14

What to Know About In-Person Youth Group During Covid-19:

- According to our church protocols, masks will be required both indoors and outdoors, and must be worn properly over both the mouth and nose (Kayla will be strict about enforcing this.).
- Youth will be expected to eat before coming, dinner will not be offered. We will play games and have a devotion.
- Plan to gather outside on the front lawn of the church. If the weather is bad, plan to enter the building at the Welcome Center (off Vienna Rd.).

FUMC Youth Learning Pod

Beginning the week of October 19, our church is offering a learning space for youth-age students (grades 6-12). This means that on their virtual learning days, we are offering space for students to come to the church and work there, with Kayla present to facilitate learning.

Many students are struggling with virtual learning and getting schoolwork done at home. This happens for all kinds of reasons, including lack of access to Wi-Fi, distractions at home, or lack of adequate supervision.

This opportunity will be exclusively available to our church youth as it gets started, with the possibility for expanding to include more area students if it's successful.
