# Highlights from the Jan. 28 Church Council Meeting

- Our congregation ended 2019 in an extremely positive financial position, with no surplus, no loss, and no monies pulled from reserves to cover expenses.
- The 2020 Stewardship Campaign was a HUGE success, receiving \$1,148,375 in estimates of giving (104% of our \$1,100,000 goal). Previous years' experience indicate people who did not provide an estimate of giving will contribute around \$225,000. That giving, along with some other sources of income, led the Finance Committee to recommend a 2020 budget of \$1,450,980, which the Council approved. This 2020 budget represents a 2.7% decrease from 2019.
- The Nursery was moved from the Preschool downstairs to Room 206 on the main floor. This has been a positive experience.
- Kids and Junior Choir have almost doubled now, thanks to the new "Wonderful Wednesdays."
   Youth and Adult Choir have both resumed as well, with an increase of 3 or 4 in each of those.
- Growth in the youth ministry has shown promise, with 15 students attending Wednesday night Youth Group in the past two months. We need more volunteers!
- In the month of January we had 82 visitors in worship,
   27 of whom are coming regularly, 14 have indicated a desire to join later.
- Our Christmas concerts were attended by 881 in total and raised just shy of \$2000 for the upcoming choir tour to England.
- Our Neighbor to Neighbor program, which pairs members of our congregation with homebound members, is off to a great start.
  - The Free Community Meal continues to go well, serving anywhere between 80 and 120 dinners on each of the last two Wednesdays of the month.
- SPRC has hired Ken McClain as our new Sunday Host after Jared Gibson resigned.
- Trustees have given a contractor the go-ahead to procure and install automatic door openers at second floor restrooms.
- Almost every room in the church has a TV or a projector. There are two 32" TVs on carts for the rooms that do not. If you need one moved for a Sunday morning, please contact Jeff Kile by noon on Wednesday.

## What Do Our Trustees Do?

Each month, we are highlighting a different administrative group, explaining what they do. This month we look at our Trustees. Composed of nine persons and a staff liaison, the Trustees "shall have the supervision, oversight, and care of all real property owned by the local church and of all property and equipment acquired directly by the local church..." (Book of Discipline, para. 2533). In other words, our Trustees oversee the congregation's land, building, and equipment. They do not perform the actual tasks associated with property upkeep. The Trustees oversee the work of our Facilities Director, Mike Corcoran, and our maintenance staff; negotiate contracts (HVAC, computers); and make monthly reports to our Church Council. They meet together on the second Tuesday of each month at 6:30 pm. They oversee 16.5% of our budget (\$239,475 of \$1,450,980).
